socks. First Unitika asked the group of volunteers to spend a day without socks so that the typical amount of leg swelling could be measured. They would then spend a day wearing the compression socks, and their measurements taken again. That wasn't so easy, though – the standard liquid displacement measurement techniques, in which the volume of the legs was measured by gauging the water level in a container of water, didn't work so well as the leg was too small to present an accurate measurement. As an alternative, Unitika decided to try structured light scanning. They obtained a scan3Dmed 3D scanner from SMARTTECH, a metrologically certified device that can obtain high-quality color scansby projecting strips of light on a surface. In addition to being used in aerospace and automotive applications, it's completely safe to use on human skin, and the 3D scanner's large volume – 800 x 600 x 350 mm – means that a large area can be scanned, such as the legs, arms, chest and face. The short scanning time of less than 0.7 second helped as well, because such a short period of time reduced the impact of the respiratory system on the scan results.

Using SMARTTECH3Dmeasure software and a rotary stage, Unitika was able to automate the 3D scanning process. The results provided them with all the information that they needed for the study. The scans showed that without compression socks, the typical volunteer's leg increased its volume by 2% from morning to evening, returning to its original state by 10 AM the next day. They tested two types of compression socks: Type B kept the leg from swelling, while Type A actually reduced its volume by 2%. Software added to the optical scanner also allowed Unitika to measure the diameter of the perimeter of the leg for further investigation. The 3D scanner and its software, Unitika concluded, were fully sufficient to carry out all the tests they needed to carry out, and provided precise results that other methods of testing were not capable of. Unitika then compiled all of the data gathered and presented it to the client in the form of a report.

Leading government bodies including The Cotton Textiles Export Promotion Council (TEXPROCIL), Handloom Export Promotion Council (HEPC), and Export Promotion Council for Handicrafts (EPCH) are participating collectively with over 390 Indian manufacturer-exporters, marking the 2nd largest participating country among the exhibiting companies, second only to China. The factory will train workers in sewing and embroidery, production line work and create a healthy and productive work environment.

The agreement was signed by Hail governor Prince Abdulaziz bin Saad bin Abdul Aziz, vice president of Aramco Nasser bin Abdul Razzaq al-Nafisi, Nesma's Saleh Bin Ali al-Turki, Eng. Abdullah bin Ibrahim al-Rakhis of al-Aliaa Foundation and Hail's Saud Fahd al-Abdah, according to a press release from the company. Nafisi stated that this MoU represents one of Aramco's initiatives in the field of citizenship, emphasizing the importance of women's participation in the market.

SMARTTECH 3D Scanner Gets the Job Done for Textile Measurement Study

Unitika Garments Technology is a Japanese research agency that examines the medical impact of textiles. Its research includes measuring the human body to assess the impact of garments on it as well as conducting chemical and bacteriological analysis to test hygiene levels. One recent study involved the testing of a particular compression sock. The client wanted to verify the effectiveness of their compression socks and understand their impact on the body, so Unitika set out to measure the level of swelling of the legs of a group of volunteers on a typical day, both with and without the $\vec{\Xi}$ told Financial Tribune. "The first of the three, carrying 50 containers measuring 40 feet each, left China's island province Hainan on December 28. The second and third set off on December 30 from Incheon Port and Shiyan in northwestern China, each loaded with 41 forty-foot containers. It will take between 14 to 15 days approximately for these cargo trains to arrive in Tehran," he added. The official noted that the trains are mainly loaded with automotive accessories and spare parts, household appliances and textile.

The first-ever train traveling the long route from China to Iran set off from Yiwu City in China's Zhejiang Province on January 31, 2016. It covered 10,399 km, passing through Kazakhstan and Turkmenistan, to reach the border station of Injeborun after 14 days. The second freight train departed from Yinchuan South Railway Station on Sept. 5, 2017, carrying some 560 tons of cargo, including mechanical equipment, ceramic tableware, crystalware and automobile accessories, worth around \$1.6 million.

1st Phase of Renovations in Capet Museum Complete

A ceremony was held in Tehran's Carpet Museum on Monday to mark the conclusion of the first phase of the renovation project in the four-decade-old building.

The officials of Iran's Cultural Heritage, Handicrafts and Tourism Organization attended the event.

"Renovations were conducted on the underground floor, parts of interior sections and the Protection Unit's office, for which roughly 20 billion Rials (\$4.7 million) were spent," Parisa Beizaei, director of the museum, said. "In the second phase, panels and other extensions will be designed and a new building will be used to display items," she added.

Mohammad Hassan Talebian, cultural heritage deputy at ICHHTO, said the project is part of the renovation drive launched in the organization.

"When I took up the position at ICHHTO, the Carpet Museum's status was undesirable, but now the first phase of renovations is complete and other phases are on the agenda," he said.

The official added that over the past few years, no efforts had been made to maintain the museum and its storerooms, showcases and halls were in dire need of improvement.

"After the Carpet Museum, other museums of national importance must be improved because they can help boost

cultural tourism," he said. Talebian also said the Fatemi-Kargar Junction is capable of turning into a cultural zone as historical sites such as the Museum of Contemporary Arts, Laleh Park and Carpet Museum are located nearby.

Mohammad Reza Kargar, ICHHTO's director for museum affairs, said museums in Iran have been neglected for years.

"The 1970s was a golden age for museums in Iran, but they gradually declined until the last decade, which marked a period of severe downturn in their operations," he said.

Fresh attention has been directed toward these places over the past few years, the most significant example of which is the restoration and reopening of the Islamic section of the National Museum of Iran.

"The renovation of National Museum was implemented for the first time after 80 years since its launch," Kargar said.

Abdolaziz Farmanfarmaian took inspiration from traditional Iranian elements to design the Carpet Museum of Iran, with the facade of the building resembling a carpet loom.

It was officially launched as a museum in 1977. With an area of 12,000 square meters, the museum is located near Tehran's Fatemi-Kargar Junction.

A recent dispute over the construction of Metro ventilators within the buffer zone of the museum has not been fully resolved yet.

Tabriz Accounts for 35% of Iran's Handmade Carpet Output

The city of Tabriz in East Azarbaijan Province accounts for 35% of Iran's hand-woven carpet production. The east Azarbaijan Province has a share of more than 35% in Iran's handmade carpet exports. Tabriz is the capital of the northwestern Iranian province of East Azarbaijan. The carpet industry in East Azarbaijan has created 500,000 jobs.

According to Chairman of Iran National Carpet Center Hamid Kargar, more than 3 million square meters of handmade carpets are annually woven in Iran, two-thirds of which are exported and the rest meets domestic demand.

Trade Promotion Organization of Iran's latest statistics show the country exported \$312 million worth of hand-woven carpets in the nine months to Dec. 21, registering a 26% increase compared with last year's corresponding period.

According to Kargar, last year's total exports stood at \$359 million.

Iran handmade carpet exports up 31%

Deputy Head of Iran's Carpet Center for Economic Affairs Mohammad Mehdi Farshchi said Iran exported \$270 million worth of hand-woven carpets during the 8 months of the current Iranian year.

Speaking during a local ceremony in Qazvin on Monday night, Farshchi said the figure shows a 31% hike compared with the similar period of a year before.

Iran exported \$290 million hand-woven carpet in 2016, he said, adding the figure rose to \$359 million in 2016, rising by 3 percent in terms of weight and and 23 percent in terms of value. He added 29 countries are the main buyers of Iran's handmade carpets, among them are 13 Asian, 11 European, 4 Americans and 1 African country.

Japan, Germany, Italy, Switzerland, France, Britain, the UAE, Kuwait, Lebanon and Qatar are traditional markets for the luxury Iranian product.

He underlined that \$141 million worth of carpets were exported to the Asian countries.

Iran's carpet exports were hit hard by sanctions imposed on the country over its nuclear program. The United States—the biggest importer of Iran's handmade rugs—banned the import of Iranian carpets, among other products, in September 2010.

Iran's textile, leather sector exports up by 18%

value of Iran's textile and leather sector's exports increased by 18 percent to \$908 million during the first eight months of the

current fiscal year (started March 20, 2017), Masoud Kamali Ardakani, director general of Trade Promotion Organization of Iran(TPOI) for exports development, said.

The sector covers textile and clothing products, shoe and leather products as well as carpet, Kamali Ardakani said, the press office of the TPOI said in a statement.

Iran exported \$279 million worth of textile (23 percent increase) and clothing products (32 percent increase), \$117 million worth of shoe and leather products (14.5 percent increase) and \$512 million worth of carpets (including hand-made carpet) in the 8-month period, he said.

The export of machine-made carpet increased by 10 percent, meanwhile the country's hand-made carpet exports registered a rise by 28 percent in the period, the official added. The US, Germany, Japan, Iraq, Afghanistan, Turkey, India, Italy and Pakistan are main destinations of Iran's textile and leather sector's exports.

The export of hand-made carpets to Germany and Japan increased by 66 percent in the period, Kamali Ardakani said. He added that export of textile products to Turkey increased by 45 percent, clothing exports to Afghanistan rised by 37 percent and leather exports to India hiked by 157 percent.

Three Freight Trains Due in Tehran from China This Week

The third, fourth and fifth cargo trains from China to Iran are due to arrive in Tehran by the end of January2018, the deputy head of the Islamic Republic of Iran Railways, Mostafa Davoudi,

What do you think about imposing economic sanctions against Iran during the past years? This sanctions have effects on relations between Spain and Iran?

We have not had any actives in Iran yet but I think it is difficult for a company to export a product. For example, a company tried to send the samples to be tested but encounter complication.
